Adopted by the Pike County Conservation District Board of Directors on May 13, 2024.

Eligibility:

The Pike County Conservation District Conservation Achievement Award is given to an individual, group, or organization that has demonstrated leadership in conservation in Pike County. This award recognizes their great work and desire to go above and beyond to help conserve our natural resources.

• Individuals, groups, or organizations can be nominated by any member of the community. Nominees must have their contributions, projects, programs, etc. contributing directly to conservation efforts in Pike County.

*Pike County Conservation District (PCCD) Board of Directors and staff are not eligible to receive the award.

*Nominees will be solicited annually and will be reviewed by an Award Committee. A recipient may not be nominated again for the award for a period of five years.

- What project(s) have they completed to conserve Pike County's natural resources? What was the outcome?
- How have they engaged the community in natural resource conservation or appreciation?
- How have they demonstrated leadership in conservation in Pike County?
