In my professional career I worked as a chemist and toxicologist. I moved to Pike County in 1994 because my wife Leanne and I enjoyed its beautiful lakes and ponds.

We lived on Walker Lake for several years before moving to Hemlock Farms.

I like science and I like the outdoors, so becoming involved with our local watershed group was a natural fit.

I helped to found the Twin and Walker Creeks Watershed Conservancy with a core group of volunteers when we became aware of excessive sediment runoff from roads. With the help of DEP funding, we built a laboratory on Walker Lake.

The Conservancy teaches neighbors how to take water samples and track valuable data to share with state and county environmental agencies.

Now that Leanne and I live in Hemlock Farms I do similar monitoring and testing with a group of about a dozen volunteers on the community association's 4 lakes and 14 ponds.

Because we live here we can monitor and sample frequently, detect water quality changes immediately and take the proper action.
